From childhood to travel, romance to dreams, significant milestones are celebrated with special objects created by skilled artisans using specific techniques.

Inspired by the ten themes which articulate The Journey of Life, the event will unveil hundreds of handcrafted objects made by talented artisans from all over the world, highlighting the diverse skills, techniques, and innovative approaches behind their creations.

Mazda prides itself on not just making cars, but crafting them.
